GROUND WORKS COMMENCE AT THE LANGSTON

In the first weeks of January, Epping residents will have seen temporary fencing being erected at The Langston, to safely cordon off the site ahead of early ground works, as the footprint of the project begins to take shape.

Hutchinson Builders has subsequently commenced demolition and excavation in the area between Langston Place and Chambers Court, which includes the former Westpac Credit Card Services building.

During this period, all truck and vehicle movements into site will take place via Chambers Court, with traffic controllers in place to manage this process.

Upon completion, The Langston will be one of Epping's largest urban renewal projects and will see the delivery of 463 new apartments to the future Epping Town Centre. In addition, The Langston will provide a ground floor retail/mixed-use precinct comprising 1,681sqm of retail space, as well as open public space and shareways connecting Epping Train Station to Chambers Court and Epping Public Library.

THOUSANDS TURN OUT FOR THE LANGSTON WEEKENDER

Held on the site of the future Langston precinct, between Langston Place and Chambers Court in Epping, The Langston Weekender festival brought together a fantastic lineup of food and beverage titans, including headliners Knafeh and Koi Dessert Bar. Over 2,000 locals and visitors turned out over the weekend to enjoy the summer sunshine and some great food, drinks and music.

Another feature was the live art performed by Andrew Dennis, who transformed the pumphouse facility in front of The Langston's sales gallery with a colourful mural, while Zara Pasfield's unique art installations enlivened the walkway that runs through the site.

TREASURER COMMITS TO IMPROVING EPPING SCHOOLS AND TRANSPORT

NSW Treasurer Dominic Perrottet will push for further investment in school infrastructure and public transport in Sydney's northwest if the Berejiklian Government is re-elected at the state election in March.

In December, Mr Perrottet said greater investment in schools, as well as the pending completion of multibillion-dollar transport projects such as NorthConnex and the Sydney Metro North West, were key cogs in the growth of the Epping electorate.

"In the last few years we've started major upgrades at... Epping and Carlingford Public," he said. "I'm committed to making sure Epping gets its fair share of education investment in the future. We can do more, and we will do more for Epping."



Mr Perrottet also said the \$8.3 billion Sydney Metro North West rail project would "change lives" when it opens in the second quarter of 2019.

"A lot of development has occurred in these areas in recent years, and we need to keep investing in public transport there as well. It's very satisfying to be part of a government that's finally delivering on this project," he confirmed.

A GLIMPSE INTO THE FUTURE LANDSCAPE OF THE LANGSTON

Did you know The Langston has a comprehensive landscaping plan, which includes 1921sqm of communal open space designed by award-winning landscape architects Arcadia?

The vision for the public domain at The Langston includes granite flagstones and mature trees lining a vibrant plaza linking Chambers Court to Langston Place – with pedestrians to be given priority in a fully-paved streetscape without kerbs. At the Langston Place entry, a grove of evergreen native trees will welcome pedestrians into the plaza, where street furniture and public seating will be available. New street trees will also be planted along the Langston Place and Epping Road frontages.

In addition, the existing trees on the western side of Chambers Court will be replaced with eight new mature London Plane trees, with these new tree plantings to extend along the western side of Chambers Court from the cul-de-sac to Pembroke Street as part of the new streetscape.

The overall result is that of a friendly, walkable and green public space, open to residents, locals and visitors alike.
